## Methodology

Latino Decisions interviewed a total of 2,200 Latino registered voters between April 3 – April 13, 2016. Interviews were conducted in English or Spanish, according to the respondent's choice. Surveys were completed using a blended sample that included online surveys, and live telephone interviews on landlines and cell phones. The margin of error is +/-2.1 percentage points.
